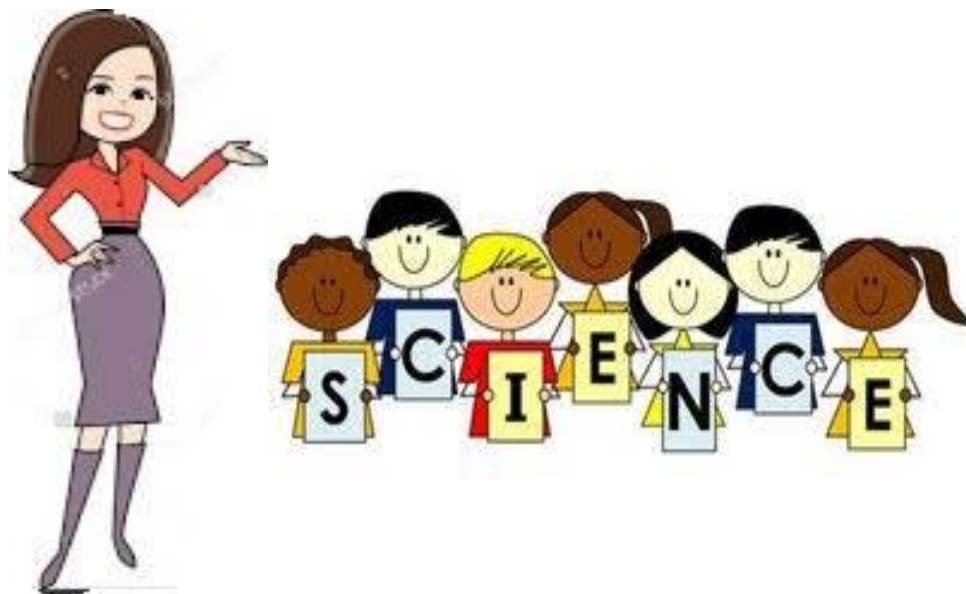
# SUMMER *Academic Enrichment*

# Benefits of Summer Enrichment



## Summer learning loss

Is the loss of academic skills and knowledge over the course of summer breaks. The loss in learning varies across grade level, subject matter, and family income. A common finding across numerous studies is that on average, students score lower on standardized tests at the end of the summer than they do at the beginning of summer (on the same test). Summer loss for all students is estimated to be equal to about 1 month (Cooper 1996), but this varies across subject matter:

**Summer programs:** Can play a role in combatting summer learning loss. Studies have shown that if students are able to participate in organized academic activities during the summer months, they are less likely to experience the losses in academic skills and knowledge before the start of the next school year.

## **Summer Enrichment**

### **Rules for Your Best Experience**

We hope your time at the Summer Enrichment program is definitely something to write home about! To help ensure the best experience for all students, we offer several rules and guidelines to follow while on campus. As with regular students, we ask that you respect others who are sharing the campus, as well as Lafayette property. To help keep summers at Lafayette the best, please refrain from the following behavior:

- Unruly behavior
- Disrespect for property or personnel
- Derogatory comments or gestures made to any members of the school community
- Intimidation of others through the threat or use of violence
- Use or possession of alcohol, illegal drugs, firearms, or firecrackers
- Tampering with fire alarms or other actions that could affect the safety of others
- Cyberbullying

While using classroom or auditorium space, please remember that these facilities are frequently located near faculty and staff offices and/or regular classes. In consideration we ask that you please refrain from engaging in the following activities:

- Running, playing, loud talking and loud music in the halls of these buildings
- Requesting to use office phones, except in an emergency

### **Safety and Security**

We want all of our students to feel safe and secure while on site. You can help us by following these directions:

- Be sure to read the important Emergency Evacuation information posted, we will have emergency drills to help bring awareness of the emergency procedures. This information includes special instructions about what to do in the event of an earthquake, fire, or other campus emergency
- Ensure that doors firmly latch behind you when entering/exiting a building
- Do not prop doors open
- Do not allow strangers into the building
- Keep doors and windows locked when you leave your room
- Do not sit on window ledges or climb in or out of windows
- If you need to leave early for medical or family reasons, please be sure to notify your teacher

# ARRIVAL AND DISMISSAL PROCEDURES \*\*

After 8:45 A.M., parents MUST come into the office and sign his/her student in\*\* If students are signed in by a parent after 8:45 a.m. the tardy will be documented as an unlawful tardy. Arrival Times  
CHILDREN ARE NOT TO BE DROPPED OFF TO SCHOOL BEFORE 8:10 A.M. We do not have staff available to monitor student safety. Students who are not participating in a school-sponsored activity or a teacher's help class should not arrive before 8:15 a.m.

## Parent Pick-Up

FOR SAFETY REASONS, PARENTS ARE NOT PERMITTED TO GO DIRECTLY TO THE CLASSROOM TO PICK UP THEIR CHILD Parents picking up their child from school must park in the parent parking lot and come to the office to sign out their children. The children will be called to the parent pick-up area. Classroom instruction will not be disrupted for early dismissal unless a note is presented from the parent or guardian at the beginning of the school day for medical appointments or other urgent reasons.

The procedure for picking up your child is as follows:

Please be prepared to show a driver's license. Names of any persons picking up a student MUST BE on file in order for the school to release the child or confirmation MUST be given by the parent or guardian.

- 1) Parents must report to the office to sign out students.
- 2) Parents MUST sign student's name and teacher's name on "PARENT PICK-UP" sheet.
- 5) Students will be called to PARENT PICK-UP AREA .

\*Parents who send in notes to pick-up their child at the end of the day need to follow the same procedure. If a parent doesn't report to the office before the buses are called, the child will be put on the bus. If a parent is running late, they must call the office by 1:30 p.m. if they want their child to be held at the building until they arrive. Under these circumstances the child must be picked up no later than 2:00 p.m.

## Earlier Dismissals

Early dismissals are discouraged because of disruption of instructional time. However, if an early dismissal is absolutely necessary, then a written request must be sent to the teacher on the morning of that dismissal stating the reason and designating the time you will arrive to pick up your child. The student will be called to the office once you arrive at the office. If a dismissal is prior to 1:35 p.m., parents should report to the school office, sign the child out, and ask the secretary to call the child to the office. Children are released only to a parent or guardian unless a note has been received from that parent or guardian designating the adult who will be meeting the child. Identification MUST be produced to ensure everyone's safety. The person picking up the child must have their name on the child's emergency list, which will be verified on the Building Secretary's computer at the time the child is picked up. Children of estranged parents will be released only upon the request of the parent whom the court holds directly responsible for the child and who is the parent or guardian registered on the school record.



Students may not arrive on campus before 8:15am and must not remain on campus after 2:00pm. Students will not be allowed to enter the building prior to the start of the school day unless special arrangements have been made for a student to be with a teacher.

## Dismissal From the Program.

A student may be dismissed from the program for the following...

- Refusal to adhere to the program safety rules and behavior expectations
- Fighting
- Parents late pick-ups three or more times
- Three or more unexcused absents
- 5 or more tardies

## Please Note:

To register for our Summer Program, you can either download an application or apply online. Please note that payment in full is required to complete your application. Registration is non refundable.

Urban Heat Academy's Summer Enrichment Program tuition is 200.00 dollars for the three weeks. The 100 dollar deposit will be applied to your tuition. Tuition includes limited materials, courseware, instruction and supplies. Parents will be asked to provide basic essentials such as paper, pencils, and backpacks.
